Make sure your name is clear, use both the negative and positive space within the circle. Good composition!!! Keep design inside of the circle and when art work is completed, cut out.







Image Development

Before you begin your good copy...

- Make a few pre-drawings in your sketchbook to design your name and how it will be placed onto your circular paper.
- Write down words that describe you: interests, hobbies, favorite: people, pets, animals, colour, events, etc. Draw at least 5 of these words, you are allowed to cut pics from magazines or from printed images from the internet (see teacher for printing any pics).
- Think about placement of images with your name to ensure your name stands out.
- Think about colors and how you place them to enhance your name and overall composition.
- Think about what materials you will use and how you will demonstrate art skills: pencil crayons, paint, collage, drawing, shading, use the elements and principles of design (look it up if you don't know).
- Demonstrate how resourceful you are.
- Demonstrate how you persevere when it feels difficult.
- Demonstrate how you can produce a finished piece of art... very different than a rough draft.
